

### Christchurch cycleways to cost \$252m as city council proposes delaying completion

More than 1200 cyclists use the new UniCycle route from Canterbury University to the central city each day.

Christchurch's network of cycleways will cost an additional S90 million to complete and will not be finished for another 10 years.

The total cost of the 13 cycleways has now ballooned out to \$252m, up from the S162m signalled two years ago and the S68.3m first proposed when the council envisaged the cycleways would be largely on-road.

In 2016, the completion date of the cycleways was pushed out from 2020
